APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS: Using a rotary spreader, cover the entire areas where moles are present with a two phase application over a two week period. The initial application will drive moles out

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS: Using a rotary spreader, cover the entire areas where moles are present with a two phase application over a two week period. The initial application will drive moles out of affected areas and the second application will ensure they do not return for up to 45 days. DAY 1: Apply Mole Scram Professional to the entire affected area of lawn starting at the area furthest from where you want the moles to exit, then water for approx. 20 minutes. Where the area permits, apply Mole Scram Pro in a band at least 30 feet beyond and around the infested area where tunnels and holes are present. DAY 14: Apply Mole Scram Pro over the entire affected lawn, watering in the same way. *Where possible*, locate mole runways, then punch 1" holes every 10 feet and drop granules into the holes and cover with soil. Also apply to the end of each runway. *SEE FULL APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS INSIDE.*
